1) Purpose:

This EWF Award is to be made annually to recognise achievement of an IWE/EWE diploma holder in delivering the responsibilities of a welding coordinator in accordance with ISO 14731 and ISO 3834-2, EN 15085-2 or EN 1090-1.

2) Criteria:

The following criteria must be satisfied for nominations to be eligible for consideration for this award:

1. The individual must hold an [EWE diploma](#) or be certified as CEWE.
2. The individual must have been working as a responsible welding coordinator for a minimum of 12 months for a European-based manufacturer, fabricator or repairer certified in accordance with ISO 3834-2, EN 15085-2 CL1, or EN 1090-1 EXC3/4.

3) Nomination requirements:

The nomination (1000 words maximum) must be made by the employer or a direct client organisation and must express how the competence of the nominee has contributed to the quality of welded production. The contribution can be related to project outcomes, efficiency of operation, growth of the enterprise, or development of skills or technical capability, but the personal involvement and responsibilities of the nominee must be clearly identified. The nomination may refer to published works but must contain sufficient detail to enable the nomination to be assessed on the basis of the text of the nomination alone.

The individual must provide a statement (500 words maximum) expressing how they feel the EWE diploma or CEWE certification has contributed to their competence in welding coordination and the achievement(s) highlighted in the nomination.

4) Selection process:

ANBs will analyse the nominations for eligibility against the criteria and will select the best nomination, on a national basis, that satisfies the purpose of the award.

[The chosen National Nomination must be submitted to the Management Team by the ANB using the official EWF Nomination Form and must include a verified, up-to-date CV of the nominee. A copy of the nominee's diploma/certificate and the company's certification should also accompany the form. Any additional relevant documentation may be included and will be reviewed.](#)

The EWF [Management Team](#) will organise an Awards Committee to analyse the national nominations and select the best nomination on a European basis. The Committee will comprise:

- EWF President
- EWF Chief Executive
- One or more other EWF Board members
- Other technical experts, if required

The EWF [Management Team](#) will inform the winner, the nominating person and the local ANB of the decision.

5) The award will include:

The award certificate will be presented to the winner during the EWF event in October. As part of the prize, EWF will arrange and cover travel, accommodation, and complementary registration for the event.

If the winner is unable to attend, the certificate will be sent to the nominating ANB.

The winner and his/her employer will receive publicity through the EWF website and Newsletter

6) Schedule:

Nominations to be submitted to local ANB by 31 March.

Each ANB is required to submit at least one national nomination.

National nominations to be submitted to EWF Secretariat by 30 June.

EWF Awards Committee will select the winner by 15 September.

Winner will be notified by 30 September.
